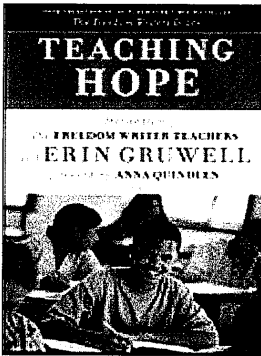

The **Freedom Writers** phenomenon began when Erin Gruwell taught in a classroom where she faced the hopelessness of a community scarred by racial tensions and poverty. Undaunted, she fostered an educational philosophy that promoted diversity, tolerance, and communication. She continues to replicate her success in classrooms around the nation. *Teaching Hope* shares the stories of Freedom Writer teachers who provide insight into the struggles and triumphs of education in all of its forms.
