Dear MA/Credential Students,

I wanted to share some information with you on what I hope will be helpful resources:

1.) substitute teaching opportunities and 2.) Teacher workshops (in October) that you can attend for free.

**Substitute Teaching:**

**A.)** Pajaro Valley USD is also accepting applications for substituting. Anyone can pick up a packet at the district office located at 294 GREEN VALLEY RD., WATSONVILLE, CA. I am also sending a link to their substitute teacher information page on their website which lists the requirements:

**B.)** Santa Cruz County Office is accepting substitute applications from credentialed teachers **and student teachers**. Below is a message from Denise Pitman-Rosas from the Santa Cruz County Office of Education (Human Resources Division):

"If you are a student teacher in Santa Cruz County, you may sign up for a substitute credential through the Santa Cruz County Office of Education. Please see below for more information on requirements and steps.

If you are interested in getting a sub permit while you are a student teacher please call me for an appointment. You can reach me at 831-466-5755.

You will need to have the following with you when you arrive for the appointment:

- \* Official transcripts verifying Bachelor's degree (they may be opened out of the envelope but must have the official stamp or seal)
  - \* Official verification of passage of CBEST
  - \* Negative TB test results (valid for 4 yrs)
  - \* Substitute Registration form (can be downloaded from our website:  
[www.santacruz.k12.ca.us](http://www.santacruz.k12.ca.us)<<http://www.santacruz.k12.ca.us/>> -click on Human Resources, then Sub Services, then Experienced Subs)
  - \* Driver's license
  - \* Fingerprint fee: \$52 if you already have a Certificate of Clearance with the CTC, \$71 if you do not)—CHECK OR MONEY ORDER ONLY
- \* After fingerprints clear, we will recommend you to the CTC for your Sub Permit. Once we do that you will need to pay \$57 to the CTC for the Sub Permit. Please note that the sub permit is valid for one calendar year for the state of California.

\*We are located by Harvey West Park and Costco in Santa Cruz."
