

Tips for success

- Come prepared. Bring multiple copies of your letter of introduction, resume, letters of recommendation and copies of your credentials as recruiters will not have access during the fair to materials you submitted online.
- Develop a plan of action which gives you confidence and sets you apart from the crowd.
- Keep yourself and your materials neat and streamlined; don't carry too much.
- If the interview line seems long, move along to another school district. You can always come back later.



- Research before the fair. Know what the districts are searching for and how you can fill that need.
- Establish eye contact, present a firm handshake, introduce yourself and explain why you are interested in speaking with a recruiter.
- Conduct yourself professionally at all times. Remember that you are on stage even as you stand in line or move about the interview area.
