Graduate Student Health Insurance Waiver

All students are required to have health, dental and vision insurance. Students who already have their own health, dental and vision insurance and wish to waive out of the UCSC Graduate Student Health Insurance Plan (UC SHIP) for Summer Quarter 2024 must complete an <u>online waiver</u> (found under "What to Do") through the UCSC Health Insurance Office by June 30, 2024.

Your waiver application must be completed and submitted by the June 30, 2024 deadline or you will be charged for university insurance.

Billing and Payment Information

Student Business Services (<u>sbs.ucsc.edu</u>) is responsible for generating eBills and accepting payments for your MyUCSC Student Account. eBills will be available on your<u>MyUCSC</u> account. Complete Immunization and Tuberculosis Risk Screening Compliance Process There are several immunization requirements for UC Affiliates:

1) COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements (may be updated over the summer)

This <u>policy</u> applies to all UC students, trainees, personnel and all others who work, live, and/or learn in any of the University's locations or otherwise participate in person in University Programs.

Covered individuals are required, subject to limited deferrals, exceptions, and associated non-pharmaceutical interventions, to be <u>fully vaccinated</u>, <u>including boosted</u> (if booster eligible), against COVID-19 before physically accessing the University's locations and programs.
 There are limited <u>exemptions</u> for covered individuals.

2) Flu Vaccine Policy

- The University of California issued an <u>executive order</u> on Oct. 8, 2021, requiring flu vaccinations for all students, trainees, personnel, and all others who live, work, and/or learn, live in any of the University's locations.

3) University of California Immunization Policy

- The University requires incoming and re-admitted students to have certain vaccinations and a screening for tuberculosis (TB). These are also known as "medical clearances."
- The required vaccinations and screening prevent serious diseases that spread easily.
- If you are living, studying, or coming to campus for any reason and you don't meet these requirements, you could be prevented from registering for future classes. The only exceptions to this policy are medical exemptions. Learn more about the UC medical <u>exemption policy here</u>.
 - The deadline for all required vaccines (except Flu) is before you come to campus. However, please consider the deadline to be "as soon as possible" so you don't risk enrollment holds.



Parking Permits

If you are planning to park on campus during the summer session, please visit the UCSC <u>Transportation and Parking Services (TAPS) website</u> for information on parking permits for Graduate Students. Email <u>tapsales@ucsc.edu</u> if you have questions.

We recommend that you purchase your parking permit on a quarterly basis, since your class schedule changes each quarter.

Please note: Parking regulations are strictly enforced on campus. You need a parking permit to park on campus. We suggest that you carpool with classmates; you will find that you are on similar class schedules. Before committing to the expense of quarterly parking passes you may want to arrange shared transportation.





Student ID Cards

MA/Credential students may obtain a Graduate Student ID Card from the <u>ID Card Services</u> Office (*located on the first floor of the Bay Tree Bookstore Building*). ID card services are open from 10:00am - 4:00pm, Monday through Friday.

A UCSC Student ID is issued to new students free of charge. New students receive a validation sticker as well (if all fees have been paid). The sticker will signify that you have paid all fees and are registered as a student.

Your validated and stickered Student ID allows access to various campus offices and services which include; the library, health center, field house, dining halls, and all Santa Cruz Metro buses. Your Student ID is required by the Office of the Registrar for access to records and services. In the event your Student ID's magnetic strip no longer functions, please bring the card to ID Card Services to have it examined. Note for UCSC undergrad students: If you were a UCSC undergraduate you will need a graduate student ID card. To obtain a grad student ID card you must bring your current undergrad UCSC ID card with you.

All State Credential Requirements are due: July 1st, 2025 State Credential Requirements

The following state credentialing requirements must be completed prior to application for the Preliminary Credential at the end of your second summer, July 2025. The department's deadline to submit verification of requirement completion to Credential Analyst, for your credential application is July 1, 2025. Students are encouraged to submit their verification documents upon completing their requirements throughout the year rather than waiting until the July 1 deadline.

- U.S. Constitution Non UCSC exams: submit original copy of Certificate of Completion here. All CSU graduates have met this requirement through coursework.
- CPR Requirement. Submit
 copy of your valid CPR card (Infant/Child/Adult CPR). See below for more information about CPR options.
- Preliminary Technology. Approved coursework (or CSET Tech. I & II): <u>Submit copy of</u> <u>passage of course or CSET score</u> <u>report here.</u> If you complete UCSC Extension XSC 209*: Department will verify with Extension.

Due July 1st, 2025 US Constitution Requirement and Test Dates

You may **fulfill the US Constitution Requirement** through the **Education Department test** offered during the Fall, Winter and Spring Quarters. The tests are **free**. **California State University (CSU)** graduates have **met** this requirement through undergraduate coursework. **UCSC courses** that meet the US Constitution Requirement: **POL 20**, **POL/LGST 111A, POL 120A, History 10A** (formerly 25A). CPR - STATE Credential Requirement

CPR certificate - **must include Adult, Child, & Infant** and meet the standards set by the American Red Cross and the American Heart Association.

Infant/Child/Adult CPR is required. Certification must be valid upon application for the Preliminary Credential through September, 2025.

CPR COURSE Options: Online courses, in person, or blended courses are accepted. *However, if you opt for a* <u>blended course</u>, you must complete an in-person skills check.

Online CPR Option: The following online course has been approved by the department for meeting the CPR requirement: <u>ProTrainings Healthcare BLS.</u>

Deadline to verify completion of CPR: July 1, 2025. Please submit an electronic copy of your valid CPR Certification card to the <u>Credential Requirement canvas</u>. CalFresh and Other Campus Resources for Food Security

Below is information below about CalFresh and also about a number of other campus UCSC resources to increase student food security.

While we are happy to say that the UCSC MA/C Program is an approved Calfresh Employee and Training Program, we are devastated and furious that Calfresh is not available to DACA, international and undocumented students. The university asks that if you have DACA, or are an international or undocumented student, that you contact <u>Slug Support Case Management Program</u> to find other means of getting food assistance (also see below).

Graduate students in the MA/C program also must still meet <u>CalFresh eligibility</u> requirements (e.g. citizenship and income). The major benefit of the UCSC/MA program being listed as an approved program is that students who are participating in the program will not have to meet the work requirement (typically students must at least work 20 hours or more per week or 80 hours a month on average).

What to add to your CalFresh application:

1) Proof of enrollment in the UCSC MA/Credential Program.

2) The attached letter stating that the UCSC MA/Credential Program is an approved CalFresh Employee and Training Program.

Grad Student Lounge and Mailroom

The Education Grad Student Lounge and Mailroom is in McHenry Library Room 2167. The handle on the door has been changed and you now need your student ID to enter the lounge, and most folks typically need to attempt to open the door 4 times until it finally opens. This is a shared space for all Education graduate students, MA/C and PhD. Unfortunately, we have no financial support for the equipment in this room - you will need to troubleshoot any printer issues or pool funds for additional toner cartridges. Since this is a shared space, please clean up after you use it. We thank you for remembering to be respectful of the various needs of all who enter and want to use the room.

The university offers a <u>Graduate Student Commons</u> located near the bookstore. There are rooms that can be reserved for quiet activity, they have computer equipment for check out, and there are printers. For <u>more information...</u>



McHenry Library Services

If you haven't had a chance to visit McHenry Library, try to stop by either <u>virtually</u> or in person. There are some special services and collections that you will want to know about (see below). Remember that you can access electronic journals and databases while on campus and in the library. <u>Your UCSC photo ID card is your</u> <u>library card – it must be activated at the Library Circulation Desk</u>. Once your card is activated, the barcode becomes your login for access to electronic journals and article databases from *off* campus and for reserving study rooms online. A few of the services and collections offered:

• Multicultural and Award-Winning Children's Literature Curriculum Collection. McHenry Library an excellent <u>collection of children's literature</u> located on the fourth floor.

•Computer stations to check email and work on documents (e.g., MS Word).

·Laptop checkout-Mac or PC-for temporary use.

•Study rooms for approximately seven people, some with display screens you can connect to your laptop. <u>Reserve</u> online.

•Media Center (on the first floor) has a wide variety of DVDs and CDs for checkout. There are also individual and group listening and viewing rooms.

***<u>Food and drink are allowed in the library</u> following these guidelines: "Think snack and wrapped items; avoid foods that have a strong smell or are messy; use covered drinks; leave your area clean and report any spills."
